SERVICE RECORD

Enlisted at Camp Wyatt, near Wilmington, N. C. 1861. In May 1862 the 18th Regiment, as part of Gen. Branch's Brigade, went into Virginia and became part of Gen. A. P. Hill's Division, Gen. Stonewall Jackson's Corps, Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. Participated in the battles of Hanover Court House, the Seven Battles around Richmond, Second Manassas, the operations in Maryland, Harper's Ferry, Charlesburg, Gettysburg (where he was wounded) Fredericksburg, Spottsylvania Court House, Chancellorsville. At Chancellorsville his regiment was in the brigade of five regiments commanded by Gen. James H. Lane, who had succeeded Gen. Branch, slain at Sharpsburg 1864. Late in 1864 he was at Petersburg, later was on duty in the trenches and lines around Richmond and participated in the final scenes of the war at Appomattox.
