

SUMMARY OF WILL OF ISHAM PITTMAN I

May 31, 1823


1. To wife, Absila Pittman, eleven slaves, household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils, still, two grindstones, to dispose of at her pleasure. Plantation to use during natural life.
2. To nephew, John Pitman, negro Morris and his heirs.
3. To nephew, Newett Pitman, 250 acres of land east of Hogg Swamp in Juniper Bay. . Part of 500 acres bought by Isham Pitman and John Rowland.
4. To Silas and Hugh Pitman, sons of Joel^{JR}, part of tract bought from Abraham Barfield, west of Old Field Swamp and appurtenances.
5. Land to nephew, Hardy Spears.
6. I give the use of one acre of land for the use of the church with its appurtenances forever.
7. I give one grist mill with the land on each side of Mill Branch joining Joel Pitman's^{JR} other land which I gave him.
8. To nephew, Elias Pittman, plantation where I now live and rest of land not before given away.
9. To nephew, Jesse Pittman^{II}, five slaves. Jesse to give heirs of Noah Pitman^F \$500.00.
10. To niece's son, Allan Gaddy, all my blacksmith tools.

Lastly, I give all the property remaining in the hands of my wife and one dollar each to all my lawful heirs not heretofore mentioned.
